Formula	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The proportional formula for those eligible for benefits starting in 2025 (age 56 and younger in 2019).	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For those with noncovered earnings and a noncovered pension who are first eligible for benefits from 2022 to 2060 (age 59 to 21 in 2019), the higher of either current law or the proportional formula.• For those first eligible for benefits starting in 2061 (age 20 and younger in 2019), the proportional formula.
Rebate	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The rebate will go to individuals subject to the WEP who are first eligible before 2025 (age 57 and older in 2019) or receive foreign pensions.• The rebate is a flat, monthly payment.<ul style="list-style-type: none">— \$100/month for workers and \$50/month for spouses/children.— Increased annually by the COLA.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The rebate will go to individuals subject to the WEP who are first eligible for benefits before 2022 (60 and older in 2019) or receive foreign pensions.• Same as 115th legislation
Statement	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The SSA must include noncovered earnings in the Social Security Statement to allow individuals to verify the accuracy of the agency's earnings records	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Same as 115th legislation
Enforcement	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Pilot partnerships between the SSA, state/local pension systems, and potentially the IRS, to improve information about noncovered pensions.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Same as 115th legislation
